

Fire Pit Guidelines

CONDITIONS FOR BURNING IN A RESIDENTIAL, RECREATIONAL FIREPIT (INCLUDING PORTABLE FIRE PITS)

Fire Pits shall be carried out in compliance with the following conditions:

- 1. The surface area or cooking area of the fire pit is less than 1 metre (3 feet)
- 2. The fire pit must have enclosed sides and not be higher than 60 centimeters (2 feet) above the ground.
- 3. The fire pit is to be constructed of bricks, concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal, or other suitable non-combustible components, as approved by the Village of Clyde.
- 4. The fire pit must have a spark arrestor mesh screen, with openings not bigger than 1.25 cm (1/2 inch) and made of expanding metal or equivalent.
- 5. The fire shall be located in an area free of dry grass, brush, or combustible soil, and adequate clearances to any combustible material shall be maintained.
- 6. The fire pit is at least 3 meters (10 feet) from all buildings, property lines and combustible materials and is not located over any underground utilities or under any above ground wires or foliage.
- 7. Only burn clean fuel (clean, dry wood).
- 8. Not used to burn refuse or waste matter.
- 9. Does not emit sparks onto neighboring property.
- 10. Flame height cannot be higher than 90 centimeters (3 feet).
- 11. Wind conditions shall be less than 25 km/hr.
- 12. The fire is to be supervised at all times by a responsible person, until such time that is has been extinguished. A fire shall be deemed to include hot ashes and smoldering embers resulting from the fire.
- 13. A fire extinguisher or garden hose must be present for extinguishing any spot fires that may occur. If you choose a garden hose, then it must be connected to a working faucet.
- 14. This permit shall be presented to a member of the Clyde Fire Department or Peace Officer when requested to do so.

SECTION 10 PERMITTED AND PROHIBITED FIRES

- 10.1 No Person shall set, or cause to be set, any Fire within the boundaries of the Village except as otherwise provided for under this Bylaw.
- 10.2 No person shall burn, or cause to be burned, any refuse, waste, junk, garbage, structures, debris or other noxious substance within the boundaries of the Village.
- 10.3 When a Fire is set in contravention of Section 10.1, or during a Fire Ban issued pursuant to Section 12, the owner or occupier of the land, or the Person having control of the land upon which the Fire is lit shall:
 - 10.3.1 Extinguish the Fire immediately; or
 - 10.3.2 If unable to extinguish the Fire immediately, report the Fire to the Fire Department as soon as possible.
- 10.4 The following types of Fires are permitted:
 - 10.4.1 Pit Fires;
 - 10.4.2 Fires fully contained within an indoor fireplace or Outdoor Fireplace;
 - 10.4.3 Recreational Fires; and
 - 10.4.4 Incinerator Fires.
- 10.5 This Bylaw does not apply to any industrial or commercial type Incinerator Fire that is required to be licensed under the *Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act*, R.S.A. 2000, c.E-12, as amended, and regulations there under.
- 10.6 This Bylaw does not apply to any Fire set for training purposes for the Fire Department.

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
